

Education at Home

Success in education comes not only from what is done in school, but also from the hard work completed at home. Homework is an essential part of learning. It develops important independent study skills and encourages students to take responsibility for their own learning.

You have a key role to play in supporting your son's learning and your help at home will have a real impact on success in school and beyond.

What can I do to help at home?

<u>Establish</u> a routine for doing homework. Late afternoon or early evening is better before everyone gets too tired!

<u>Create</u> a learning environment- ensure there is an area at home for your son to complete his homework,

<u>Help</u> with organisation- check the homework diary. Help in packing correct books/equipment/kit in the school bag. Help your child plan his time to allow him to give his homework his very best effort.

Be <u>interested</u> in school life. Ask about the school day and talk with your son about how he is getting on. Encourage him to make the most out of school by getting involved in:

- classroom discussions and tasks.
- extra-curricular activities outside the classroom.

Encourage your son to see the <u>value</u> of learning. Stress the importance of homework in reinforcing and developing the learning that goes in in the classroom. Also, encourage him to regularly review his learning to prepare for school tests and exams.

<u>Communicate</u> with the school. If you know your child is experiencing problems, let us know. Early identification of problems is important. Good communication between home and school is valued at BBMS and helps children do well. Be sure to attend parent-teacher consultations.

WHAT'S AVAILABLE?

Parents can work with their sons, using strategies for learning that are located in each year group's Microsoft Team e.g. Year 8 Team.

Parents should ask their son how to access these so that they can have a better understanding of what they are working on in class with their teachers, but importantly, to keep working at home using these resources, either individually or with the help of someone at home.

ASSESSMENT WEEKS

- There are 4 Assessment Weeks during the year for BBMS pupils
- During the Assessment Week, pupils will complete tests in each of their subjects
- The data used in these tests allows us, and you, to monitor the progress your son is making
- The week before Assessment Week is called 'Revision Week'. This is when teachers will be revisiting what is on your son's test.
- Two weeks before each Assessment Week, pupils will be engaging with Learning to Learn resources. This is when their teachers will be showing them strategies to help with revision.
- As a parent/guardian, you are able to help your son in his revision by working with him; using the resources that have been made available.
- It is important that your son consults his Personal Learning Checklist (PLC) for each subject to monitor the areas he needs to improve before and after each test.
- It is important that your son sets aside time for revision. Please see a template overleaf that he could use.



Click on MySchool login option






Accessing Microsoft Teams

On the home screen, click on the Office 365 app and click on 'continue to sign in'

Downloading Teams to a computer

- Sign into My School
- Click on Office 365
- Click on the Teams Icon
- You will see this image
- Click on DOWNLOAD APP the second image appears
- Follow the instructions
- The App will then be on your computer, and you do not need to go through My School





Downloading Teams to a phone

- Open the App Store on your phone
- In the Search bar type MICROSOFT TEAMS
- · Tap the download link to install the app on your phone
- Once the app has finished downloading and installing, tap the open button
- When logging in username is@c2ken.net
- Password you use for My School

SIMS Parent App

Instructions for setting up SIMS Parent App

Before you start, some points to note;


- It's a 2-stage process you are required to register first and then install the SIMS Parent App on your smart phone or device (or just use the website, if you prefer)
- Close all other windows during the registration process
- Any usernames/passwords will relate to the account you are using to register for the app (so whatever you set up when you created your Facebook/twitter/google/Microsoft/etc account)

Registration Instructions;

Step 1: Open the invitation email that was sent noreply@sims.co.uk to the email address you provided us. Check your junk mail if it has not in your Inbox.



Step 2: Click on the "click this link" link within the



Step 3: Choose the account type you would like to register with. *Be aware that SIMS ID can't be used!*

Step 4: Check your name and click on the Register button

Step 5: Answer the security question – this will usually be the date of

birth for one of your children, following the format of dd/mm/yyyy. For example 26/02/2005



Step 6: After clicking on the Verify button you might see the "Registration – Account Verification" screen for a few seconds. That is OK

Step 7: Once complete, you have registered and are logged in to the web version of the Parent App

From here you have two options. The preferred one is to install the SIMS Parent App from the Google Play store or from the Apple store. Or you can use the web version of the Parent App which can be accessed from https://www.sims-parent.co.uk.

Setting up the SIMS Parent App;

Step 1: Go to the Google Play store or the Apple store and search for SIMS Parent Step 2: Install the App...

Step 3: Open the App

Step 4: After the welcome screen you might get the Sign In page. If so then click on the Sign In button which will take you back to the page that you saw during registration. On the Choose Account Type page select the option you registered with and login using your credentials

Step 5: The Parent App welcome screen opens.

From here you can view reports, request updates to contact information, view timetables and see attendance information.

SIMS Parent App aims:

- To increase parental engagement
- To allow you to stay on top of your son's progress through school
- To improve communication methods with home
