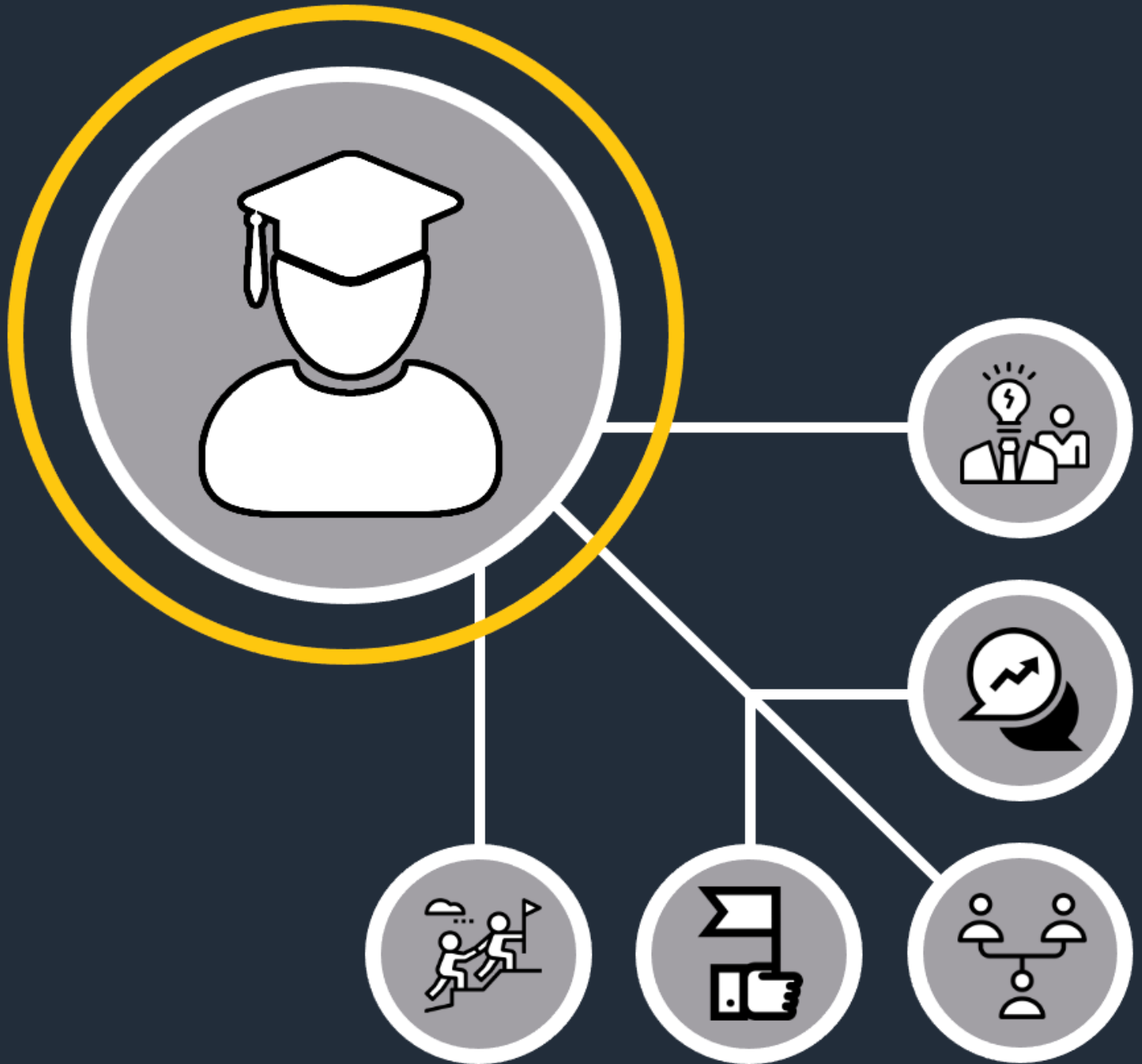

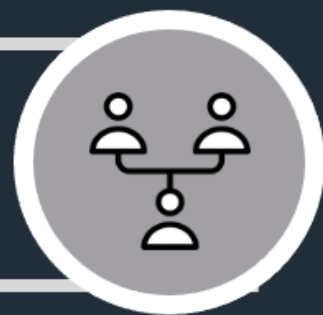
KEY GUIDANCE AND INFORMATION FOR ALL

THE INFORMATION

General Information

Any student in Key Stage 4 can apply to become a House/Vice Captain.

Leadership Potential

To qualify to apply to become a House Captain, you will either:

- have demonstrated strong leadership potential and the willingness to take responsibility in this role
- believe that you have the potential to be a leader and show a willingness to take responsibility in this role

Consistently Positive

You will also have demonstrated a consistently positive approach to the school and your learning, this means:

- Reliability – Good attendance and punctuality
- Presentation - Wearing full school uniform (**shirt, tie, school jumper**). This also includes adherence to school expectations of jewellery and make up
- Good conduct - No recent behaviour issues at any time during the school day, and consistently positive and co-operative conduct in all lessons and at social times
- Organisation – Coursework and homework being completed within the set timescales
- Ambition/Aspiration – the majority of effort grades on subject updates are good. You want to be successful in all you do.

- Support the school during and beyond the normal school hours
- Support House competitions and ensure maximum participation for your house
