




Geography is the study of places and the relationship between people and environments.






## Compass Points

**Ideology - Steve Neale**

- Genre - Media systems provide spectators with the means of recognition and understanding.
- Genres are instances of repetition and difference.
- Difference is absolutely essential to the economy of genre.
- The systems offer grounds for further classification.

**Level Structure - David Gauntlett**

- Binary opposition Good vs Evil - Police v Criminals
- media products shape how we understand ourselves and the world
- His research found that people use media content to construct their identities and explore the diverse ways they could be.
- The mass media is a force for change.
- The mass media has become more liberal and considerably more challenging to traditional standards... this has been a reflection on changing attitudes, but also involves the media actively disseminating new values.

- Representation and Reception
- representation is the process by which members of society use language... to produce meaning. These meanings are not fixed; they are produced and contested by society.

**Audience positioning - Van Zoonen**

- Superwoman

- Semiotics
- Semiotics is the study of signs, signs consist of signifier and its meaning - the signified.
